A Time To Be Thankful

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to equipment failure. The successful operation of equipment is due to the efforts of numerous club members who have taken a vested interest in the following aspects: Timing and computer operations-Tim, Peggy and Robert Steck; Sound operations-Pat Ezard; Trailer delivery-Jerry Akins, Jerry Braunberger, Ed and Deborah Thompson; Equipment service and maintenance-Jerry Akins and Jerry Braunberger. Also, we are thankful to Jerry Akins, who provides the space for parking of the club trailers without any cost to the club and is helpful keeping the trailers organized. Phil Akins and Brad Moffett and others who help at Edge Motorsports donate their time doing repairs on the trailers are to be commended. Finally, I am thankful that I am retired; have the time and energy to help with equipment organization which hopefully plays a part in making our events successful.

Even with the best equipment and finances an event would not be successful if it were not for the people who willingly give their time to carry out the responsibilities required to run the events. The registration crew is generally the first to arrive often sleepy eyed with their coffee in hand on a race day which include Cheryl Baugh, Bonnie, Jim, Lorin, Sean Mueller, Carin Nichols, Catherine Reed, and Megan Steck. The service provided by Sherri Lyons during the past four years as the Novice Chairperson is commendable. Our appreciation is expressed to Clint Ipock, who is resigning his position after serving the past two years as the Safety Steward. In addition, the willingness of each racer to serve as event station workers, announcers, recorders and all other race day assignments is significant. Finally, the assistance of members and other racers who remain after the event to assist with picking up cones and other details necessary at the close of the events has been better this past year and we appreciate all your efforts.

No "State of the Club" article would be complete without some statistics. I am of the opinion that these numbers verify that the EESCC is as successful as any club in Oregon. Mailings go to 700 individuals including 350 by Email and 350 via postal mail. Individuals who have registered for membership in the club stand at 175. We had 160 individuals register for Icebreaker, our opening event, and had an average of 115 entries during the eight regular events.

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The annual banquet at the Hilton Hotel on Nov. 1st was the culmination of another successful year. General opinion from many of the 115 people in attendance was that this was one of the best banquets that we have had. The food and service was excellent.
