*** Revised Ruling On Neck Restraints ***

On May 28th we were notified that NHA had amended their ruling on neck donuts. If you are in a class that allows a neck donut, and if you are going to wear a neck donut instead of a hans type device, you must also be wearing a "full face" helmet, NOT one with an open face." Please plan on bringing the correct safety equipment to the Hillclimb.

EESCC conducts this event under a Special Use Permit with Willamette National Forest, and is an equal opportunity outdoor recreation provider.

Note: all drivers will have a work assignment. If you are unable to work we ask that you have someone who can work in your place. We are still, of course, accepting volunteer workers too. Any help is always appreciated.

Also note: NHA requires you to become a member BEFORE you can register for any hillclimb. Please go to their website (below) and sign up BEFORE you register for our event.

HOW TO ENTER:

If you are new to hillclimbing you will need prior solo (generally a year or so) or road racing experience, so please contact the EESCC if you have any questions about qualifying.

You may register either on the web or by mail. To register online, see the hillclimb pages on our website <<u>www.eescc.org</u>>, and pay either online using PayPal, or by mailing in your check. Your payment must be received within one week to hold your pit position. ENTRY FEES:

Online registration opens May 4th and <u>will close July 4th or when entry limit is reached if</u> <u>earlier</u>. Register early - all fees increase after June 20th, entries after that date must pay the full late fee. Mail in registration closes June 27th - do not mail an entry after June 27th, please go online to enter. Also, you must order your shirt by June 10th to guarantee one. RULES AND REGULATIONS YOU NEED TO KNOW NOW: PLEASE READ THEM

This event is sanctioned by the Northwest Hillclimb Association. Please read the rules at: http://www.nhahillclimb.org, a copy will be available at tech also. All entrants much pay \$10 to become a member of NHA. Please go to their website and join before sending your entry.

***Any vehicle coming into a National Forest can potentially bring in "invasive species" (unwanted weeds/plants). Please wash all vehicles, especially motor homes and car trailers that usually sit for a while, paying special attention to the undersides of the vehicles, before bringing them up to the hill. Thanks.

***Also, please bring oil/fluid absorbent and sealed containers to remove any fuel or oil spills you may have in the pit area. All re-fueling is to be done on the pavement. Take precautions and remove all spills from the site, no matter how small.

- 1. *** No alcohol allowed at the hill. Period. This is a NHA rule.
- 2. ***Cars not licensed for the street are not allowed to be driven up and down the hill on reconnaissance runs. Only street legal vehicles are to be on the road to learn the hill.
- 3. All drivers must have a valid driver's license. Any license or permit which requires another licensed driver in the vehicle is not acceptable.
- 4. All entrant cars must have seat belts and shoulder harnesses or straps. Any car that has an aftermarket race seat or fixed back seat installed must have MINUMUM of a threepoint harness installed instead of stock belts.
- 5. All helmets must be Snell 2005 rated or newer. (Snell "SA" rated helmets are strongly encouraged). We have a few loaner helmets.
- 6. Roll bars are required in all open top cars, production, and GT classes also. Integrated roll bar, e.g., Corvette, Porsche, etc., are acceptable. Roll bars are highly recommended in all cars. The roll bar must be above the driver's head, be adequately braced, and be constructed to GCR specifications. We may request that drivers sit in their cars at tech with helmets on so we confirm proper clearance.
- 7. Entrants must wear LONG sleeve shirts and long pants made of cotton or Nomex while driving. Nomex driving suits meeting SFI 3.3 are highly recommended. Closed-toe shoes must be worn during all competition runs and it is recommended that the shoes be made of leather or other fire resistant material. Head and neck restraints are highly recommended, such as a HANS. As of January 2018, all competitors must wear a minimum of SFI 3.3 neck donut. However vehicle drivers participating in Non-DOT approved R-Compound tire classes require the use of an SFI certified HANS-type device (regardless of what tires are actually mounted on the vehicle).
- 8. Fire extinguishers of 5BC rating or fire systems are mandatory in all cars, and unless they are Halon they must have a CURRENT (WITHIN 13 MONTHS) tag! Extinguishers must be securely mounted to the vehicle structure with METAL brackets.
- 9. Driver's side window must be up during your run, unless a window net or arm restraints are used.
- 10. All cars must have spark arrester mufflers.
- 11. At the hill, no smoking is allowed except <u>inside vehicles on the paved road</u>. This is a Forest Service requirement.
- 12. Driver's meetings are MANDATORY. First runs may be forfeited if meeting is missed. We will have a sign in procedure.
- 13. No practicing on the hill before or after the event. *This will be grounds for disqualification if confirmed.* Speed limit in pit areas is 5 MPH. Speed limit on the rest of the hill except during timed runs is 25 MPH maximum!!

CAR CLASSIFICATION:

New for 2017: NHA is mostly using Solo (autocross) classifications for ease of classing your car. There are still a few specialty NHA classes, but mostly if you autocross- it will be easier to class your vehicle.

HOW TO GET THERE:

Oakridge is located on beautiful Hwy 58 just 40 miles south of Eugene or 130 miles N.W. of Klamath Falls via Highways 97 and 58. Find the map link from our website!

To get to the hill from Oakridge go southeast on Hwy 58 to the Hills Creek Dam Road just outside of Oakridge. Then take road 21 to the west side of the lake and dam, approximately one mile, to road 2102. Then go two miles up the road to the event. Watch for 2-way traffic!
