### What is Time Speed Distance Rally?

A team consisting of a driver and a navigator follow written instructions to follow a defined route while maintaining a stated average speed. At undisclosed locations along the route, cars are timed and assigned penalty points for being early or late at a timing control.

#### What do I need to bring?

- A Partner
- A setable time piece with seconds (cell phone clocks are not recommended)
- A clipboard, pencils, pens, and hiliters are all helpful.
- A copy of the General Instructions (rules) available on-line at <u>www.eescc.org</u> Also available at the event start.
- A sense of adventure

#### What kind of vehicles are allowed?

Any street legal vehicle can enter the event. Rallys have seen a diverse assortment of vehicles entered including Sports Cars, Muscle Cars, Hot Hatches, SUVs, Minivans, and even a motorcycle with sidecar.

#### Is this legal? Is this Street Racing?

A TSD rally is not a race. A TSD rally is a low-risk test of precision driving not an all-out speed contest. In addition to precision driving a rally tests the ability of the team to work together to navigate toward a successful finish.
