

Lead Foot At The Pinewood Derby

Part of the evening activities at the Eugene Sports Car Club awards banquet is a Pinewood Derby competition for members who build Boy Scout Pinewood Derby cars. They have two categories of cars. They have a "Stock class" for cars constructed under official Boy Scout rules and a "Modified class" which adds 5 oz. to the car and any wheels/suspension can be used. Here is a picture of "Lead Foot" my Pinewood Derby entry.



An official Boy Scout track is used for the race. The cars are electronically timed. Four cars race at one time. Each car races on each slot on the track. And, like autocross, the fastest time wins. In addition to the racing, people attending the banquet vote for "People's Choice" and "Butt Ugly".

This year Una entered the car I built last year and I entered Lead Foot. To make a long story short, Lead Foot was slow not ugly and not the people's choice. Una's entry (my old car) beat Lead Foot along with many others (It did not finish last, but close to it). The winning car in the Stock class was a thin block of wood wrapped in a Hershey Chocolate wrapper - clever idea! This car's owner is Lorin Wamsley.
