We are in the process of selecting another charity who will receive part of the funds. Also, all proceeds from the Blind autocross are being given to the Guide Dogs Federation for the Blind. In addition, we are doing road cleanup 3 times a year on a 2 mile stretch of highway 99 in Goshen resulting in 129 man hours of labor for the adopt a road program.

Ruben also presented the "Gear of The Year" award to a very deserving individual, DaWayne Kerbs. Bonnie Mueller followed with a number of other special awards.
